

# VILLAGE OF MORTLACH

## BYLAW NO. 2016-002

### A BYLAW TO REGULATE AND CONTROL THE OPERATION OF SNOWMOBILES/ATV'S WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF MORTLACH, SASKATCHEWAN

The Council of the Village of Mortlach, in the Province of Saskatchewan, hereby enacts as follows:


1. This Bylaw shall be cited as "The Snowmobile/ATV Bylaw".
2. In this Bylaw, the terms "highway", "license", "operator", and "snowmobile" shall have the same meaning as provided in The Snowmobile Act, 1978.
3. "all-terrain vehicle" and/or "ATV" means a self-propelled vehicle that:
  - i) is designed primarily for the movement of people or goods on prepared surfaces;
  - ii) has wheels in contact with the ground; and includes:
  - iii) a restricted use motorcycle;
  - iv) a mini-bike; and
  - v) an all-terrain cycle;
4. Notwithstanding the provisions contained in Subsection 1 of Section 21 of The Snowmobile Act, 1978, and subject to the following subparagraphs, it shall be lawful to operate a snowmobile/ATV between the hours of 7:00 o'clock a.m. and 11:00 o'clock p.m., Central Standard Time, on all highways within the corporate limits of the Village of Mortlach.
  - A. Snowmobiles/ATV's shall be operated in single file as far to the right-hand side of the highway as is practicable.
  - B. No person shall operate a snowmobile/ATV on any highway within the corporate limits of the Village of Mortlach at a speed in excess of 30 kilometers per hour.
  - C. No person shall operate a snowmobile/ATV on private property without consent of the property owner.
  - D. No person shall operate a snowmobile/ATV on any highway or portion of a highway within the corporate area of the Village, except for the purpose of going from a point of origin within the Village to a point outside the Village, or for the purpose of returning to the said point of origin from a point outside the Village; provided that the corporate boundaries of the Village are entered or exited at a point as near as possible to the point of origin and that the most direct and practical route possible between the point of entry or exit and the point of origin is taken.
5. Notwithstanding the provisions of The Snowmobile Act, 1978,
  - a. it shall be lawful to operate a snowmobile/ATV on a highway during an emergency when all other vehicular traffic is unable to travel on said highway due to snow or weather conditions;
  - b. it shall be lawful for the Royal Canadian Mounted Police to operate a snowmobile/ATV on a highway at any time.
6. Any person who violates, contravenes or disobeys or refuses, omits, neglects or fails to observe, obey or comply with the By-law is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of not more than \$500.00 or in default of payment thereof to imprisonment for a period not exceeding 30 days.
7. That Bylaw No. 2012-01, dated the 12<sup>th</sup> day of December, 2012 is hereby repealed.


8. This Bylaw comes into force and effect on the date of the final passing.
